NEW RECYCLE SYSTEM

Our Recycle Centre on Highway 592 (formerly and affectionately known as "The Dump") has installed two new compacting units to handle recyclables, and has put in place new rules that should help make our recycling lives easier.

Now, you can sort your recyclable materials into just two bins – one for household metal, glass and plastic, and another for fibre or paper products.

Household metal, glass and plastic items include:

 Cans (aluminum, steel and tin); bottles (glass and plastic; clear and coloured); aluminum foil; shopping bags; Styrofoam; plastic wrap; all other recyclable plastic.

Household fibre products include:

 Newspapers; flyers; cartons (milk, juice and egg); boxboard; catalogues; cardboard boxes (broken down please); magazines; phone books; fine paper; books.

You can purchase additional blue boxes at the Recycling Centre for \$2.00 each. The recycling of the materials themselves is free.

Our Recycling Centre will continue to handle garbage the same way it has in the past. There is no charge for your first 6 bags of garbage each month. Additional bags will cost \$1.00 per bag.

For items such as building materials, shingles, tires, appliances, scrap metal, furniture, etc., a tipping fee will be charged when they are dropped off.

The Recycling Centre is open from 9:00 until 4:00 daily, but is closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

NATURE'S WAY

The MNR has launched a program for reporting illegal hunting and fishing activities through a toll-free phone number.

1-877-TIPS-MNR

This tip line will operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, all year, so that people can report illegal activities such as:

- Fishing or hunting out of season;
- Taking more game than allowed;
- Night hunting;
- Unauthorized shoreline alterations.

If you are reporting a violation, be sure to provide as much information as possible, including the date, time and location of the offence and the violator's licence plate number and the make and model of the vehicle.

WINTER UPDATE

December and January so far have seen fairly steady snowfall, but not necessarily a lot of accumulation due to the mild spells that have occurred fairly frequently.

While there has been some machine and people traffic on the lake itself, weather conditions so far have not been favourable to creating safe ice. Please exercise caution if venturing out on (hopefully!) frozen water. If the ice at the shoreline is cracked or soft, stay off, and keep in mind that dark snow on the ice may be an indicator of a weak spot.

HELPFUL HINTS

Many of us have generators that we run when there is a power outage. If you are one of those people, please be careful where you place the generator when you run it.

One couple on Bay Lake had used a generator for years – before they had a furnace installed. During the first power outage of the season, they set up the generator in its usual place under the deck. What they didn't realize was that it was now right next to the furnace intake. When they started feeling ill, they assumed they were coming down with the flu. They had just decided to go to bed and sleep it off when a nagging feeling made them check the carbon monoxide levels. You guessed it – the levels were through the roof!

So, check that your generator is in a safe location when it is running – and make sure you have carbon monoxide detectors and that they're working properly. The couple in this story had removed the batteries from their detector the night before after the power went out because the beeping was keeping them awake!
