NEW! - RECIPE EXCHANGE

MUSHROOM AND CHEESE EGG PUFFS

8 oz. (227g) pkg. sliced button mushrooms
1 small red pepper, chopped
3 garlic cloves, minced
1 ½ cups (375ml) frozen hash browns
2 tsp. (10 ml) paprika, preferably smoked
Generous pinches salt and pepper
8 eggs
1/3 cup (75 ml) milk
1 tbsp. (15ml) Dijon mustard
2 green onions, sliced
1 cup (250 ml) crumbled cheese (feta or cheddar)

Recipe (cont'd)

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 F.
- 2. Coat a large frying pan with oil and set over medium heat. When hot, add mushrooms. Stir often until browned around the edges (about 5-7 minutes).
- 3. Add pepper, garlic, hash browns, paprika, salt and pepper. Stir often until potato has heated through (about 2 minutes). Turn into a bowl and refrigerate until cool.
- 4. In a medium bowl, whisk eggs with milk, Dijon, salt and pepper.
- Coat a 12 cup muffin tin with oil or PAM. Divide mushroom mixture between cups. Sprinkle with green onions and cheese (they will be very full, but that's okay). Pour some of the egg mixture overtop and let it soak through, then top with remaining egg mixture.
- 6. Bake in center of oven until set in center (about 25 to 30 minutes). Let stand for 5 minutes, then run a knife around inside edge of cups. Carefully turn puffs onto a plate.

To Make Ahead

- a. Prepare mushroom mixture (steps 2. & 3.).
 Stir in green onion and cheese and refrigerate covered overnight.
- b. Prepare egg mixture (step 4.) and refrigerate covered overnight.
- c. When ready to bake, spoon mushroom mixture into oiled muffin cups. Pour egg mixture overtop and bake (step 6.).

Makes 12 puffs.

Nutrients per puff – 119 calories; 7.3 g. protein; 6.9 g. fat; 7.5 g. carbohydrates; 1.1 g. fibre; 1.1 mg. iron; 96 mg. calcium; 206 mg. sodium.

WINTER UPDATE

December was incredibly mild. What little ice there was actually left the lake the week before Christmas. Since then, there has been steady snowfall, but not the accumulations we are used to. Colder temperatures have resulted in the lake freezing over, and the first snowmobiles went across it in mid-January. Be cautious if venturing out on the ice. Stay off if the ice at the shoreline is cracked or soft, and be careful of dark snow on the ice which may be a sign of a weak spot.



If you snowmobile on Bay Lake and use the boat ramp for access, be sure to **go around the ramp on the north side**. Winter traffic over the

concrete causes heaving in the spring and we would like to avoid the resulting damage and repairs.

Some people have been using the snow mound at the south of the ramp as a jump. Please do not do this!

DRIVING ON THIN ICE

You may have heard the rumour that a vehicle went through the ice on Bay Lake and sank. Unfortunately, it is not a rumour – it is true. Here is what we know at this time...

Someone drove their Jeep onto the lake on February 5th, towing a trailer and an ice fishing hut. The ice was not thick enough to support the vehicle and it sank. The police, fire department and ambulance all attended and, luckily, the people involved were not hurt. Un-luckily, we now have a Jeep sitting at the bottom of the lake between two of the islands.

The Chair of your Environment Subcommittee has been in touch with the OPP, the Ministries of Natural Resources and the Environment, Mayor Bill Core and Councillor John Dunn.

Our MP, Tony Clement, agreed to contact Environment Canada/Department of Fisheries and Oceans for their take on this matter. Our MPP, Norm Miller, has also been contacted.

Below is the text of an email that John Dunn received from Norm Miller's office in response to his inquiry on our behalf:

Good day Mr. Dunn,

I just spoke with Paul van Schyndel, Enforcement Supervisor with the MNR.

He indicates that they will continue to monitor the situation at Bay Lake.

He also indicated that Jim Mills, Case Manager with the MOE in North Bay, is going to ensure that the jeep, trailer and ice shack are removed once the ice has gone. The jeep is fairly new and they feel that oil/gas will remain contained. There is a propane tank in the ice hut which should remain intact as well.

The MOE is responsible for handling the situation. The MNR will become involved if there is a chance that a motorized vessel could hit the jeep or ice hut. Paul (van Schyndel) indicated that the jeep is down about 40 feet.

Hopefully this situation will be remedied within the next couple of months.

Peggy De Forge Constituency Assistant Norm Miller, MPP Parry Sound - Muskoka Removal of the Jeep is not proceeding at present because of the unsafe ice conditions for such an activity.

We feel it is essential that the Jeep be removed from the lake as soon as possible and are pursuing all avenues to ensure that this happens. If the removal of the Jeep does not proceed as promised, we will be asking for your help. If that time comes, we will provide contact names and numbers and ask that you add your voice to this issue by calling or writing to someone on the list.

As this situation is constantly changing, please check our website for updated information.

In the meantime, don't drive full-sized vehicles onto the lake, and ensure the ice is thick enough to support a snowmobile or ice fishing hut before you set out. The area where the Jeep went down apparently had only 3 inches of ice, and reports are that even the thicker ice is of a very poor quality.

The bass season is being extended by an extra week in 2007, so you can start catching bass on Saturday, June 23rd. Please do not start fishing earlier than the official start of the season. Even "catch and release" can disrupt nesting and negatively impact future fish stocks.
