RECIPE EXCHANGE

Thanks to Lee Davidson for providing this recipe...and for making these delicious treats for sale at the Silent Auction.

Yum Yum Bars

Base:

1 ¼ cup (300 ml) flour ¼ cup (50 ml) packed brown sugar ½ cup (125 ml) unsalted butter at room temperature

- 1. Preheat over to 350°.
- 2. Lightly butter an 8" (2 litre) square pan.
- 3. In a bowl, stir flour with sugar using a fork.
- 4. Work in butter until coarse crumbs form.
- 5. Press over bottom of pan.
- 6. Bake in centre of oven 15 to 20 minutes until light golden.

Topping:

2 tbsp (30 ml) flour ½ tsp (2 ml) salt ¼ tsp (1 ml) baking powder 2 eggs 1 ½ cup (375 ml) packed brown sugar 1 ½ tsp (7 ml) vanilla ½ cup (125 ml) each chopped walnuts, chopped maraschino cherries, and unsweetened coconut

- 1. Stir flour with salt and baking powder.
- 2. In another bowl, whisk eggs and stir in vanilla and brown sugar.
- 3. Mix together the flour and egg mixture.
- 4. Fold in the nuts, cherries and coconut.
- 5. Pour onto baked base and bake for 20 to 30 minutes until topping is golden and slightly jiggly.
- 6. Cool on a rack for at least 1 hour.

You can refrigerate these goodies for up to 1 week, or freeze them for up to 1 month.

LAKE UPDATE

- The month of June saw very little rainfall and as a result the lake water level has been going down. It dropped 5" from early June to early July. We will continue to keep an eye on it...and the weather forecast...and make adjustments if necessary.



SUMMER BOATING & DRIVING

- In addition to all the usual safety precautions that should be followed while boating, we have a special two special notes for waterskiers: ➤ be careful out there...there seems to be an unusual number of logs and deadheads floating in the lake this year; ➤ always have a spotter in the boat and always wear a life jacket.
- The OPP is planning to set up radar traps on Bay Lake Road because of the number of complaints about speeding. To avoid getting a ticket, follow the posted speed signs – 60 km/h on Bay Lake Road between Highway 592 and North Bay Lake Road, and 40 km/h on Bay Lake Road around the lake.
