WRAFT UPDATE

Property tax reassessments by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) have been cancelled for the next two years to allow for the implementation of the recommendations laid out in the Ontario Ombudsman's report.

Bob Topp, Executive Director of WRAFT (Waterfront Ratepayers After Fair Taxation) and a spokesperson for The Ontario-wide Coalition After Property Tax Reform (CAPTR), announced qualified support for this two-year moratorium on property tax assessments.

"CAPTR supports the moratorium, but believes that the Finance Minister must use the next two years to create a fair property tax system in Ontario. He should start by listening to all groups, including CAPTR, who share that goal," says CAPTR spokesperson Bob Topp.

CLEAR LAKE / BAY LAKE HALL

The future of the Clear Lake / Bay Lake Hall is uncertain. Recent changes in the rules of the Gaming Commission of Ontario have made it impossible for the Hall to continue with its traditional fundraising methods. If the Hall is to stay in operation, those running it need our help and ideas.

LAKE STEWARD REPORT

FISH

Bay Lake will be stocked with **Lake Trout** this year by the MNR at no charge. Thanks to those people who caught a 6 lb Lake Trout already this year and released it.

Unfortunately, there have been many reports of people fishing **Bass** out of season. This is illegal -- even if you release the fish! So, before the last Saturday in June, please do not fish around the rocks or shoreline where the Bass are nesting. Let's give the Bass a chance to re-stock the lake on their own.

REGULATIONS AND SAFETY

MNR patrols will be coming onto the lake on a regular basis and they will hand out fines to those breaking the rules. So:

- ✤ Don't fish out of season;
- Always carry your boating licence with you;
- Don't speed near the shoreline or in the No Wake zones.

WATCH YOUR SPEED: Bay Lake Road is now entirely paved and unfortunately some drivers have found that this makes it easier to speed. Please follow the posted speed limits to avoid possible encounters with the other drivers, pedestrians and wildlife that also use the road.

OUR LAKE IS PRECIOUS HANDLE WITH CARE

We are sad and dismayed to report that at least 3 cottagers have been seen dumping sand in or near the lake this year. Not only is this illegal, but it jeopardizes the valuable resource that we all share -- Bay Lake. **Do not do this!** If you see someone do this, call the MNR and report it.
