# BAY LAKE CALENDAR & PHOTO CONTEST

#### LAKE UPDATE

- Last year, the **lake ice** went out on April 20<sup>th</sup>. This year it will be a bit later seeing that the ice was thick enough on April 19<sup>th</sup> for 2 deer to run across it from the south side to the north side, frolick and play along the shore, then run back. There is some open water and ducks and geese have been spotted...and the loon's call has been heard.
- **Fire Permits** are once again required for outdoor fires. You can pick yours up at the Recycle Centre on Highway 592.
- The **speed limit for ATVs** on the roads surrounding Bay Lake is **20 km/hour**.
- Don't be a water polluter. Even if you purchase biodegradable cleaning products, don't use them directly in the lake. When buying biodegradable cleaning products, look for verification such as the EcoLogo symbol or a statement about the product's breakdown stats ("fully biodegradable within 28 days").
- Be a responsible boater be careful not to spill gas into the lake when refuelling, always use a spotter when towing, watch out for other swimmers and boaters, and reduce your speed in no-wake zones.

# SNOWMOBILE ETIQUETTE AND SAFETY

We received a number of complaints from property owners that someone had driven a snowmobile around the lake very close to the shoreline – so close, in fact, that they drove up and over people's docks. In one case, they didn't manage to get up and over the dock so they ended up driving right into it. In another case, they not only drove over the dock, but also over the paddle boat and canoe that were being stored on it, damaging the canoe in the process.

We are asking everyone who snowmobiles on Bay Lake to please respect the property of others and ensure their own safety. Do not drive close to the shoreline or over other people's property. If you have guests up, please relay this to them as well. Don't let one or two people give every snowmobiler a bad name.

#### HIGH SPEED INTERNET

There is the possibility that some people on Bay Lake may be able to get wireless high speed internet access through the tower that is servicing the Clear Lake/Kearney/Emsdale corridor. If you are interested, contact Vianet (<a href="http://www.vianet.ca">http://www.vianet.ca</a> or 1.800.788.0363) and arrange for a site check. If you can get the signal, the cost will be \$149.95 for equipment and then \$49.95 per month for 1.5 Mbps high speed service (plus taxes). If you cannot get the signal, you will have to pay \$60.00 for the site check.

#### LOCAL SCHOOL FUNDRAISER

## EARTH HOUR PARTICIPATION

A big pat on the back to all those who participated in Earth Hour on March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Executive held a meeting at 5:00 and then spent a lovely evening by candlelight and firelight with other participants. Many Bay Lakers who were not at the lake reported that they participated at home.

While we applaud everyone who took part, there were a few places around the lake whose lights brightened the night sky. Making a few changes could make a big difference:

- Switch from a timer to motion lights, or set timers to turn off earlier;
- Use lower wattage bulbs;
- Point the lights where they're needed (at the building or pathways) and not out toward the lake;
- Use or create light caps that focus the light downwards.

### BAY LAKE SUPPORT OF THE HALL

As proposed at the AGM last August, Curtiss MacDonald, the BLPOA Treasurer, met with representatives of the Clear Lake / Bay Lake Hall to learn more about their financial status in order to make a recommendation to the BLPOA Executive on continued support.

In September, 2007, cheques totalling \$600.00 in donations were issued to the Hall to cover our contributions dating back to our 2005/2006 fiscal year. At the Executive Committee meeting held in March, 2008, additional financial support for this fiscal year was agreed to as follows:

- That we donate an additional \$150.00 to the Hall on April 1, 2008, to cover our use of the Hall for this year's Pancake Breakfast and any other use that may arise in the remainder of the 2007/2008 fiscal year.
- That we review the possibility of an additional donation this year at the BLPOA Executive meeting to be held in June 2008.

Discussions held at a number of Executive meetings resulted in agreement on the following proposal, which was presented to representatives of the Hall:

- That the BLPOA make quarterly donation payments of \$150.00 starting in our 2008/2009 fiscal year (on July 1st, October 1st, January 1st and April 1st) for an annual contribution of \$600.00.
- That we review the possibility of an additional donation to a maximum of \$200.00 at the last Executive Committee meeting of the fiscal year.

- That we confirm with the Hall that this guarantees us the following:
  - Use of the Hall on the Sunday of the May long weekend and on the Sunday of the August long weekend;
  - Access to the hall the evening prior to these events for setup if the Hall is not already booked;
  - Additional use of the Hall (at no charge) as required and agreed to by the Hall representative(s).
- That our financial support is conditional on a liaison of the BLPOA being invited to attend as a guest all meetings held by the Hall Executive.
- That we make it clear to the Hall Executive that this arrangement will require the approval of future BLPOA Executive Committees.

Bill Paterson has agreed to be the Hall Liaison. He will attend meetings held by the Hall Executive and report back on activities, decisions, financial updates, etc. It was also agreed that each member of the BLPOA Executive should try to attend at least one Hall meeting, alone or with our Liaison. Anyone attending from the BLPOA will be there as a guest or observer.

We met with Ernie Rye and Jim Hilt from the Hall and their reaction to this proposal was positive. They are looking forward to working with us in a spirit of team work and cooperation.
