WHAT WENT ON AT THE AGM

What went on at the AGM? Lots! Those of you who were not there missed a very interesting and informative presentation from Paul Wiancko, President of the Six Mile Lake Association. Paul discussed their efforts to involve property owners in the ongoing struggle with an ever-increasing goose population, and their activities in testing, and trying to maintain a high level of, water quality.

Following this presentation, those in attendance passed a motion to establish an Environment Fund so that donations can be made to those efforts. We will continue to accept donations to the Fish Fund, and to devote that money to fish-related efforts.

Those who did attend the AGM were so inspired by the guest speaker, and by the stated desire of the Executive to become more active in Environment and water quality issues, that not only did they pass the original motion to increase membership fees by \$10.00 for the 2009/2010 year, but they then made and passed a motion for an additional increase, raising membership fees to \$40.00 a year with \$10.00 of that going directly to the Environment Fund.

There was much discussion about this subsequent motion, which amounts to a doubling of the membership fees – and there was even a motion to rescind the motion for the additional increase – but in the end the majority of those in attendance felt strongly enough about the issue that the additional membership increase stood.

The meeting continued, where the work of the Executive during last year was reviewed, and the new Executive was elected with 4 new people (3 of them brand new to the lake!) volunteering to join (see page 3 for a listing of the new Executive members).

A motion from the floor also directed the Executive to try to recoup some of the cost of putting on events by either charging people or by accepting donations.

The door prizes included 4 bottles of Maple Syrup that were won by Peter and Linda Szeli, Walter Young, Glen and Sherry Vey, and Gary and Helene Jarvis, and a portable BBQ which was won by Don MacMillan.

Mayor Bill Core was on hand following the meeting to provide Township information and to answer questions.

ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

We hope to have a budget for the newlyestablished Environment Fund for the next newsletter. This budget will let you know what we will be doing with the funds ear-marked for the Environment as well as what funds will be needed to accomplish our goals.

Benthic Testing: Several of the Executive showed up at the Boat Ramp to meet with Maggie Braun from the District of Muskoka and learn about and conduct Benthic Testing.

Benthic testing tells us the condition of the water in our lake by looking at the minute critters that live in the bottom sand and muck - really weird bugs that you can only see with a magnifying glass. The quantity and variety found in a water sample tell us many things about water quality.

Our data was collected from 3 samples at a single site (the boat ramp) and then sent to Dorset, where it was analyzed and recorded and compared against the data from other lakes in the Muskoka watershed. Our results were basically in the line of "average" for the watershed. While we were hoping that our water quality would score better than average, especially considering that our lake is near the top of the watershed, it must be noted that our results are based on 3 samples from only 1 site versus Muskoka's 73 samples from 44 sites.

What we need to do is continue the process by sampling again next year at the same site at the boat ramp and expand to do our own first samples of other sites around our lake. Over time we will build records to show our lake status and if we have improved or worsened.

E-coli Testing: Testing and the equipment necessary to do it properly will be somewhat expensive. We are researching costs now with other Lake Associations.

Lake Plan: Your Executive will also be working on establishing a "Lake Plan". Many lakes in Muskoka have such a Plan and when it is done properly it can be accepted by the Township as part of the Official Plan. This makes it legal. We will be asking for your help by way of questionnaires and/or meetings. We have an opportunity at this time to determine the future of Bay Lake for us and those who follow us. Please help us by following this process in the newsletter and on line and taking part by volunteering to help.
