

#### **ENVIRONMENT ACTIVITIES**

We are thrilled that Dave Vyse has agreed to chair the Environment Committee, heading up a team including Judy Dunn and Don MacRae plus Executive members Lee Davidson, Bill Paterson, and Glen Vey.

The committee has reviewed the testing results for the past year and indications are that our lake is currently in good shape. While there are now eight testing sites, plans are to add sites in the new year. It is hoped that those who participated the "adopt a site" program will do so again and that more people will join them in paying for the testing at specific sites.

The committee is also checking into a number of environmentally friendly products to recommend to members and is looking at samples to hand out to new owners and possibly an environmental hand-out to all residents on the lake.

### LAKE STEWARD REPORT

The MNR has confirmed that 500 lake trout were stocked in Bay Lake in the spring of 2009 and that the plan is to continue stocking the lake every second year. While this is half the number that was stocked in 2005 and earlier, the MNR's research indicates that this reduction should not affect the number of fish that grow to a catchable size.

We can help the MNR in its research by keeping notes on our fishing activity and any observed spawning activity. This information could then be submitted to the MNR.

Discussions with the MNR continue and more information will be provided in subsequent newsletters.

### THE END OF THE EMPIRE

Many of you may not have heard the news that the Empire Hotel in Huntsville was destroyed by fire. It is a tragedy for many – the owner, Dave Keay, who spent the last 10 years lovingly restoring it; the residents, many who had lived there for years and have now lost not only most of their possessions but also their home; the store owners (Saturday Afternoon, Shine, Strutter, Yesterday's Books, the Baker's Barber Shop, the Scrapbooking store and Liberty Tax Service); and the Muskoka Jazz Jam hosted by our own Doug Banwell.

The Jazz Jam was in full swing the night of the fire. Doug and his band were playing, Cheryl Stamper was serving drinks, and the guests, including Bill and Janice Paterson, were enjoying the evening. Luckily, everyone got out of the building safely. Even though there were lots of fire trucks and fire fighters, it looked at first as though it was only a minor incident. In fact, Bill was sure he would be back in the pub finishing his beer before it got too warm. As the smoke got heavier and then flames shot out of the roof, it soon became evident that this was a major event. The fire fighters almost emptied the Huntsville water reservoir in the hours it took to get the fire under control. No decision has been made as yet on whether the building can be saved, or whether it will have to be torn down.
